



- Notify Judge before entering cones that you are: Beginner, or Advanced.
- This event is intended to be a schooling level and judged horse show. We are happy to answer questions.
- There is no class order or assigned time. Come over as your schedule permits, 4 pm 8 pm.
- Please print out your course. No course copies at show, only posted at arena.

Trail Obstacle Course- Beginner


This is a WALK ONLY course

- 0. Enter through cones at a walk.
- 1. Enter cones on the RIGHT side, proceed in the serpentine pattern. Tip: if you enter on the left, you will be given a penalty score
- 2. Walk over 2 logs. Logs are 24" apart, and elevated to 6 inch at highest point.
- 3. Mailbox. Open, hold package up. Loudly tell Judge, "I have a package". Return package to mailbox.
- 4. Enter Beauty Mountain Wilderness Trail Gate space. Base is 3 feet apart. Tip: the wilderness trail gate is designed not to be touched or moved. It is for animals with packs, and to keep motorized vehicles off the wilderness trails.
- 5. Bridge. Walk over.
- 6. Walk through horizontal pool noodles. There is an opening between noodles.
- 7. Walk to "Battle Star Galactic pistol". Take pistol out of holster, shot once, return pistol to holster.
- 8. Walk out of arena through cones.

Note: Exhibitor may SKIP any obstacle if s/he, or the equine, is not ready, or feels the obstacle may be hazardous to their level. Exhibitor will receive a "-10" under penalty section for the obstacle, and will then continue to the next obstacle for scoring. Per rules for this day's event.

At the skipped obstacle; stop, look at judge, nod and touch brim of hat. This will signify to the judge that exhibitor is intentionally skipping obstacle, and is not "off course" which would result in a disqualification for the class. Per rules for this day's event.

Anza Lion's Club "Stars & Stripes" Advanced Trail Class, 07/20/19



Trail Obstacle Course- Advanced

This is a walk, jog/trot, lope/canter, stop, back, turn on the forehand & haunches, sidepass course

- 0. Enter through cones at a walk.
- 1. Stop in front of cones allowing enough space for your equine to do a turn on the <u>forehand</u> 180 degrees. Back equine on the RIGHT side of the cones; back your equine in the serpentine pattern. Upon completion, turn equine on its <u>haunches</u> 180 degrees and proceed to the next obstacle at a walk.

Tip: if you enter on the left, it will be a penalty point per today's rules.

2.- 7. Follow Beginner Trail course instructions.

Note: BMW gate will be 36" wide for beginners, and 24" wide for advanced.

Note: Horizontal pool noodles will have a space for beginners, and noodles will be touching for advance.

- 8. Walk to the rope gate. Right hand push away. After a few strides after the gate pick up the jog/trot.
- 9. Jog/trot over 3 ground poles.
- 10. At cone, pick up the LEFT lead lope/canter.
- '10. At the stop sign, stop, back 8 steps. Walk to next obstacle.
- 11. Walk to elevated (6") sidepass pole. Turn on the forehand. Sidepass over poll. At completion, turn on the haunches.
- 12. Walk to bubble wand. Take wand from holster. Open wand. Produce bubbles. It is best to hold want still and allow wind to blow through. Make sure you position wand so that bubbles do not blow back into your face, or your equine's face.
- 13. Walk through vertical pool noodles.
- 14. Walk over plywood bridge.
- 15. Exit trail area through cones.

Note: Exhibitor may SKIP any obstacle if s/he, or the equine, is not ready, or feels the obstacle may be hazardous to their level. Exhibitor will receive a "-10" under penalty section for the obstacle, and will then continue to the next obstacle for scoring. Per rules for this day's event.

At the skipped obstacle; stop, look at judge, nod and touch brim of hat. This will signify to the judge that exhibitor is intentionally skipping obstacle, and is not "off course" which would result in a disqualification for the class. Per rules for this day's event.

AQHA & 4H Trail Judging Guidelines- summary

Judge may use different association guidelines

Each obstacle will be given 2 scores, an obstacle score and a penalty score. Each exhibitor starts with a score of 70.

Obstacle Score, will be added or deducted from the overall score





Camping

- \$5/ rig
- Rent, or bring your motor home/travel trailer for yourself, or for your group.
- No hotels in Anza/Aguanga. Hotels in Temecula, 1 hour away.
- Bathroom: flush toilet and running water in sink, no shower
- Parking spots have no utilities, no lights, no electric and no water (dry camping)
- Water spicket at water trough area by bathrooms.
- There is a community water trough by the bathrooms.
- Bring a hand truck (dolly) to move water in a closed container back to your rig.
- Corrals, \$5 each.
- 12 corrals available, without water/feed buckets, or rakes. Pipe, 12' x 12', 4'6" tall, attached, may have weeds in corral (not cleared).
- Corral pre-registration reservations will be taken. Corrals are first come, first serve.
- You are also encouraged to bring your own corral, or tie to your rig.
- NO FIRE RINGS, no wood/coal BBQ, no flame lanterns, no candles. Allowed items: battery items, or RV appliances.
- Fire Department will stop by for compliance of regulations.
- HIGH FIRE DANGER!
- Please call or text Michele Brown at (760) 637-9173, to notify of camping.


Gas Stations

- NO GAS stations after you leave Temecula Town (Mobil), until Cahuilla Travel Center
- Chevron- west end of Anza town, 6 am 9 pm, easiest for horse trailer drive in/out
- Circle K- middle of Anza town, open 24 hrs- no bathroom
- Valley Auto Gas- east end of Anza town, 6 am 7 pm, easy for horse trailers
- Cahuilla Travel Center-past west end of Anza town, east of Lake Riverside Estates, open 24 hours, speed bumps at entrance drive
- Electric charging station, Anza Electric Co-op, across from Valley Auto Gas

Directions Temecula- detailed:

- ~46 mi. from I-15 to Kirby Rd. ~29 miles from I-15 to Hwy 371 turnoff.
- From Temecula (do NOT take 79 North from Winchester Rd)
- Interstate 15 to Temecula Parkway, Exit 58, CA-79 South, but goes east bound
- Temecula Parkway changes into Hwy 79 South, going east bound
- Anza Road in Temecula will be your last stop light, road changes into Hwy 79 South, east bound
- You will see a road sign to Indio.
- There is a small market and real estate office on the left
- At the STOP SIGN, turn LEFT onto Hwy 371
- This is a long, steep, up hill- see Driving Hwy 371 section for information
- At Lake Riverside Estates, the hill flattens, continue on Hwy 371
- You will pass Lake Riverside Estates, Cahuilla Casino & gas, town of Anza, Diner 371, and Mr. Happy's Mercantile
- Move into your Right turn lane and turn RIGHT (south) onto Kirby Rd.
- There is a painting of a roping horse in a sunset at the Kirby Rd intersection with "Terwilliger". If you pass it, turn around at Valley Auto Gas, about 1 mi.
- Continue 0.8 mi and turn Right into the Anza Lion's Equestrian Arena
- 39551 Kirby Road, Anza, CA 92539

DIRECTIONS from Temecula- Map attached I-15 to Temecula Parkway, east bound Changes into 79 South, east bound @ STOP sign, turn LEFT turn onto Hwy 371, north/east RIGHT turn onto KIRBY, south bound



Driving Highway 371

- Steep up/down hill. Make sure vehicles have good power, good brakes, and are in good working order. Make sure hazard lights are working on your trailer. Make sure you have reflectors on the back of your trailer. Check all lights, brakes, and fluids before leaving.
- **CHP** is 911 when calling from your cell phone.
- Call CHP immediately if you break down so that they can immediately prepare drivers for your rig ahead.
- There is only a 3" shoulder on the road; there is no room to pull your rig off the highway.
- Have your reflective vest and reflective triangles (150' past trailer).
- STAY OUT OF THE ROAD!!!!!! Do not walk into the road!!!!!!
- PEOPLE WILL NOT SEE YOU AROUND A CURVE AND THEY ARE GOING 65 mph!
- Don't run your A/C up the hill.
- Pull over at the bottom of Hwy 371 and Hwy 79 and let people pass. There is a paved shoulder after you turn left onto Hwy 371. This is your last good opportunity until you reach the top.
- It is not advised to use the turn out on the way up Hwy 371. When you pull out at 1 mph you won't be able to get your speed up and you will have more cars behind you then before you pulled over.
- There is a turn out after you plateau in the middle of the climb. You will see a sign "Turnout 1/4 mile", there is a flat, paved turn-out. The road here has a mild down hill so you might be able to get your speed up here. You can use this turn-out if you have many vehicles behind you. This is the only other paved turnout until you reach the top. Use your best judgment.
- When you reach the top of Hwy 371 there is a large dirt area on the right (south side) to pull over. This area has a "wash board" feel. The area is at the top of the hill. Before you reach the dirt pad, you will pass between rock cliffs on both sides of the road, you will see a "+" sign and the Bradford Rd sign When you reach the dirt pad, then you can pull over to the right and wait for traffic to pass.
- Hwy 371 is relatively flat from this point.
- Don't let the drivers rattle you. They know it is a climb up the hill. They might be agitated, but it is not the first time they have had a horse trailer in front of them. Safety first.
- When driving home, down the hill. If you must pull over, pull over in front of the building with the dinosaur. At the "turn out ½ mile" sign, your turn out is 1/8 mi for the dinosaur spot, behind tall group of trees. There is a pull out after the dinosaur, but it is too short, and too steep for a heavy rig to pull over and stop. This is the only safe turn out until you reach the bottom at Hwy 79.
- Turn-out paved shoulder on west bound Hwy 79, at the base of Hwy 371.
- There is also a paved turn-out in front of the Vail Lake Resort's west entrance.
